<u>Relativity Factors</u>: the individual per capita income and expenditure for each Province/Region varies greatly which reflects the difference in the costs of living worldwide. This is illustrated in the 'Big Mac Index' – a table used by economists to compare the cost of living using the price of a standard item, the McDonalds Big Mac, across the world. The table shows the number of minutes that a worker, earning the average net wage, must work in order to be able to purchase a Big Mac. This is a useful indicator to demonstrate the purchasing power of each currency.

The current and projected future resource levels across the Institute clearly indicate that there is a need to improve the systems that promote distribution of resources in a manner that facilitates equitable access for the mission of the whole Institute. The determination of what is equitable is a matter for leadership to decide. p.86

One Small Voice
