## Words of Pope Francis at World Youth Day: July 28, 2013

Where does Jesus send us? There are no borders, no limits: he sends us to everyone. The Gospel is for everyone, not just for some. It is not only for those who seem closer to us, more receptive, more welcoming. It is for everyone. Do not be afraid to go and to bring Christ into every area of life, to the fringes of society, even to those who seem farthest away, most indifferent. The Lord seeks all, he wants everyone to feel the warmth of his mercy and his love.

In this month of <u>remembering saints</u> we reflect on the challenging words of #40 from <u>Lumen Gentium</u>: All Christians in whatever walk of life are called to holiness – the fullness of Christian life which leads to a more fully human way of living... they should use their Christ-given strength to become holy that, following in his footsteps and growing in his image, and doing the will of God in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbour. And so the holiness of the Church – the People of God – will grow and bear fruit, as the life of many a saint shows clearly.

In this month of November we remember our deceased sisters in all places and over all the years of faithfully witnessing to the Gospel of Jesus with the inspiration of Mary Ward.
