From the words of Pope Francis:

Indifference to our neighbour and to God also represents a real temptation for us Christians. Each year during Lent we need to hear once more the voice of the prophets who cry out and trouble our conscience.

God is not indifferent to our world...but the world tends to withdraw into itself and shut that door through which God comes into the world and the world comes to him. ...

God's people, then, need this interior renewal, lest we become indifferent and withdraw into ourselves.

The women's world day of prayer is a worldwide ecumenical movement of Christian women in more than 160 countries, of various races, cultures and churches in fellowship and understanding who come together to observe a common day of prayer on the first Friday in March every year.

International Women's Day is a time to reflect on progress made, to call for change and to celebrate acts of courage and determination by ordinary women who have played an extraordinary role in the history of their countries and communities. This year's theme, "Empowering Women - Empowering Humanity: Picture It!" envisions a world where each woman and girl can exercise her choices, such as participating in politics, getting an education, having an income, and living in societies free from violence and discrimination.

We stand with women who speak and write and sing and dance and create art that addresses the dignity inherent in all women, who choose to stand in solidarity today and every day.

We stand in solidarity with all women in leadership: local, district, regional, national and international, with women emerging in leadership in the Church and society and in the Institute. We stand in solidarity with all our ibvm sisters everywhere. We, as members of an International Institute, stand in solidarity in prayer with women who suffer in all parts of the world for whatever reason.

May the gentle hand of our loving God embrace the world and help all people see the full value of half the human race.
