Cyclone Aila wreaks havoc in Bengal: On 25th and 26th May Aila had killed at least 82 in W. Bengal, and rendered lakhs homeless. Similar destruction was caused in the coastal regions of Bangladesh. The tragedy came close to home when a Domestic

Staff member of Loreto Darjeeling died in a landslide, and another was hospitalized for injuries suffered in the same landslide. The homes of three of our Temporary Professed Sisters from the coastal areas of WB – Jhuma, Ballika and Baishaki - were either flooded or battered by the storm. A Domestic Staff member of Entally had her whole house blown away. Climatologists and weather analysts blame the ferocity of Alia on global warming. For your information, June 5th is World Environment Day. May our desire for Earth Care be translated into action.



Bomb in Church in Kathmandu:

On 23rd May, a bomb was detonated in the Church of the Assumption in Kathmandu, Nepal. Two were killed – one being a CJ student. The CJ Sisters themselves were present in the Church at the time, and were severely traumatized by the incident. This is the first time that a Christian

Church has been targeted in Nepal.



Mary Ward's Cause: It is fitting that in this year of the 4th centenary of Mary Ward's founding grace, the Theological Commission for the Beatification of Saints, declared Mary Ward to be a person of "heroic virtue". Sr. Mechtild, CJ General Superior, feels that this is a significant hurdle overcome this year. There is hope that Mary Ward will be declared Venerable next. In 1984, the present Pope Benedict XVI, then Cardinal Ratzinger, wrote of Mary Ward: "With courage and decisiveness she opened the way in her own time for women to work in a new way in the Church... It may be said, perhaps, that precisely now Mary Ward's hour has come afresh."
