During this period students planted close to 7274 saplings at Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar Central University Campus. The drive was actively supported by the Vice-Chancellor of BBAU Dr R. C. Sobti and Principal of Loreto Convent, Sister Anjuman.

It was a step towards creating a green campus and also to benefit the students and staff by introducing them to the benefits of these plants.



In April 2017, we began class IX with 12 students. We are having classes in school, but have registered our children with a recognised school-Oxford Inter College. They have sponsored all 12 girls and boys-they paid the registration fees, gave the text books and the stationary for them. They will be appearing for the UP

Board, Class X Exam.

We also began “Pushpa Sewing Class” for our class VII and VIII girls and older girls from the surrounding slums. We have a special teacher, who is being paid by St. Agnes’ Alumnae. We have class after school from 1:30 PM to 2:30 PM.
